


DRAWING ADVENTURES OF A LITTLE CRAYON



What if I tell you that the satellite can just get lost?


Children constantly lose a variety of objects: hats, textbooks, house keys and even smartphones. For this reason, adults rarely trust their children with anything of value.

SIT AND SEE



Sit and See is a gripping first person story, told with a bitter irony, it will not leave you indifferent if you watch the news today.

The story succeeds in describing a human catastrophe – simply and without pretentiousness. The title refers to the historically important film "Come and See" by Elem Klimov about the Belarusian punitive action of the Nazis. This is no accident.

A large family – the main character Marta Kaidanovskaya, her sister Tonya, father, mother, grandfather and grandmother – fleeing the terrible sounds in their apartment, are driving (or rather, killing time in traffic jams) in a cramped car towards the Rubi-Cone border, where bombs rumble. Along the way, they have many adventures. At some point, they stop at a motel, reminiscent of the Zone in the movie Stalker, where Marta meets a writer, Andrey Bulbenko, and hands him two mysterious envelopes. The first contains fourteen scattered sheets, written in small handwriting on the back of some instructions...

"People need to know.


The story is completely ordinary. It is common for the regions where there were cozy houses once, and now only the wind is blowing. This story should be known by people who still live in cozy houses and are not to blame for what's happened. They just need to know. I think Martha wanted everyone to know, otherwise why would she have handed me these envelopes?"

It is not a story of recent events - this story can be extended to any of the active military conflicts. This is a story of refugees, told through the eyes of a teenager, it is a very important read for all time. I am sure it will stay in the history of literature precisely as one of the testimonies of the nightmare which humanity creates.





Believe it or not, but here is the book that contains 28 questions about life purpose, justice, personal boundaries, self esteem, relationships – about everything that we all care about. Ten anonymous thinkers, representing 6 religions and 4 systems of thought, give their answers to these questions. They debate, agree, or complement one another while readers may choose which reply is closer to them.

All of us, including our friends, family, and even favorite book characters, make decisions, acting according to our inner rules and principles. People tend to think that their worldviews don't contradict each other. But actually, we may mix different opinions and, for example, approach friendship and love as Christians, death as Hindus and freedom as secular humanists.

What can people do in this situation?

The book is about the history of peaceful gatherings. It shows what democracy is like, how to protect society from the dangerous nature of power, about dictators and tyrants, totalitarianism and freedom of expression.



THE LENINGRAD TALES SERIES

This series is about fear and courage, indifference and hope, about the importance of being free in your thoughts and actions at any time and at any age.

This family saga – one of the first and successful contemporary attempts to speak to children about the Stalin era. The press acclaimed The Raven's Children, the first title of the series, to be the main event in the Russian children's literature in the year of 2016.

Novels follow Shurka, Tanya, their little brother Bobka and adopted sister Sarah from 1938 to 1948. These are the darkest pages of Russian history – the time of the Great Terror, the Second World War, the Siege of Leningrad – are shown through the eyes of children. The real history is mixed with a fantasy world, so we are left to wonder if this fantasy world is real or if it's a way that helps children to explain all the cruel events around them and to overcome their fears. The author successfully combines the elements of tales and thriller novels to tell about the terrible circumstances. She does it with respect to history and to all those people – our parents and grandparents – who lived at that time. The main characters are ordinary children who love to have fun, who search for truth and justice, who have their questions to adults. It is a story of survival and childhood in the Soviet Union.

SHE'S A STUDENT THE WAY TO WOMEN'S UNIVERSITY

Education is an independence, possibility to choose a profession, destiny and way to earn money. Even today some girls aren't allowed not only to go to the university but even go to the school.

Bestuzhev Courses were a unique phenomenon, they were set up by women to become one of the first women's universities in the world.

Note the difference between allowing women to attend men's universities (even without giving a diploma!) and making a special non-state institution for women. Three founders of Bestuzhev Courses achieved the impossible in the conservative society by getting necessary permissions, attracting the best professors, arranging investments and fundraising, building a campus and equipping high-tech laboratories. Where else was it possible at that time? This book tells the story of the courses and their alumni from the idea that appeared in late 1860s till 1919 when the Soviet government merged them with another university.

THE SURVIVORS THE GREAT TERROR

What does one person's life and fate mean, when a government makes its big decisions?

These short graphic novels tell the stories of six real people who were unjustly imprisoned in the USSR between the 1930s and 1950s.

There are six lives here but there were up to 20 million there.

The word "Gulag" (a Russian acronym for the Chief Administration of Corrective Labor Camps) has become a symbol of lawlessness, life on the edge of death, slave labor and brutal human rights abuse. Every tenth prisoner did not survive. Many famous people worked in the Gulag camps: the writer Alexander Solzhenitsyn, the rocket engineer Sergei Korolev, and others. This book tells the stories of six real people—victims of mass repressions. They had different professions, social status, political views, they lived in different regions of the Soviet Union, but all of them were unjustly accused, convicted and killed.


This picture book tells the story of a six-room Moscow apartment throughout the 20th century through little residents' diary records, historical facts and description of simple household items of different historical periods.
